## Research internship

- Mandatory part of the master

## Internship: place in curriculum

- 2nd year
- November until July/August

## What is the research internship?

Students are required to conduct a research that involves:

1. planning,
2. conducting and
3. analyzing the results of the student's **own research project**. This work will result in an individually written
4. Master's thesis (in English).

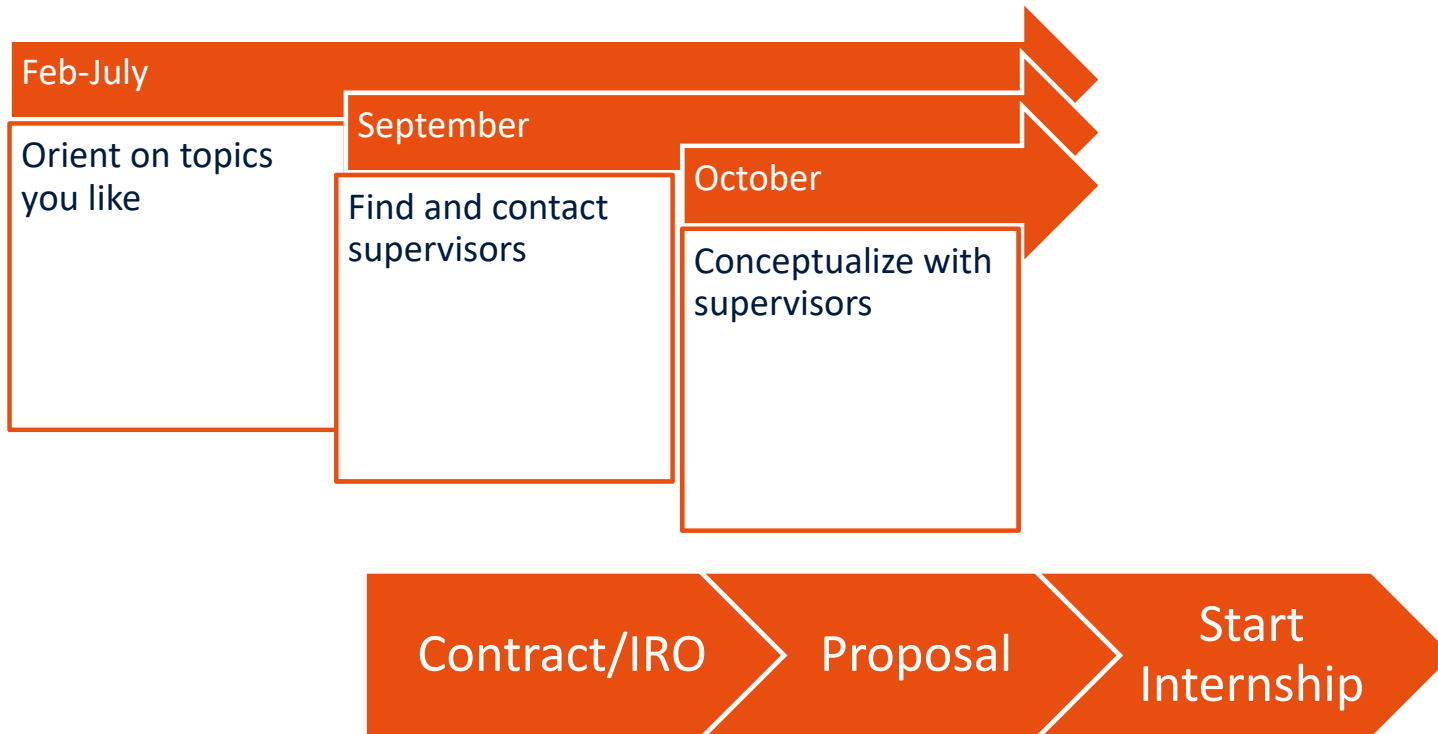

## Internships under COVID-19

- Updates on UM / FPN COVID-19 policy will be communicated regularly. Keep yourself informed: [UM COVID-19 website](#), [FPN COVID-19 website](#), UM/FPN Newsletters, UM email.
- Be alert, and in case of problems during internship, contact supervisors.
- Make a Backup plan. We always have a plan B.

## Academic back-up plan

Due to the rapidly changing nature of COVID-19, an internship (either in the Netherlands or abroad) may involve risks for your health, finances and study progress (e.g. in the event of closure of the host institution).

In order to minimize the (potential) impact of COVID-19 on your internship, and to make sure students receive adequate support and supervision from their host organization and FPN throughout their internship all Master's students doing their research and/or clinical internship (either in the Netherlands or abroad), are asked to make an **academic backup plan** in consultation with their supervisors.

The Backup plan form needs to be fully completed and signed for approval by you, your first and second supervisor *before* applying for the internship.

## Backup plan

- Can you conduct your study as intended?  
Will you be able/allowed to access the internship setting?  
Will you be able/allowed to see test subjects/collect data?  
Can you find alternative ways to collect your data (email, telephone..)?  
Can you use other (already collected) data?  
Can you process and analyse the data at home (think of hardware/software)?  
Etc..
- Alternatives:
  - Working with existing data provided by supervisor
  - Theoretical review (using Cochrane guidelines of review)

## Assessment of master thesis

- You always need **2 supervisors**

### Internal internship

First supervisor has PhD degree

Second supervisor can be a PhD student if in their second year or later

### External internship

→ If supervisor there has PhD degree:

→ Then he/she is/can be the 1st supervisor.

→ You need a second assessor from FPN with PhD or equivalent

## From Proposal to Master Thesis

You and your supervisors will

- Specify the research questions
- Design and Set up the experiment / theme
- Talk about Number of Participants
- Talk about Statistical Analysis
- Make a time plan about Nov-Aug steps.
- Plan a mid-term evaluation
  
- **START this process in time, incorporate all into proposal**

## Components of research internship and Workload

- In total 50 EC (28 hours workload per EC)

Of which

- Proposal 1 EC
- Internship 35 EC
- Master Thesis 14 EC

## Master's thesis

- **Individually written, in English.**
- Meets **formal guidelines** (e.g. APA-style, length), and the **content guidelines**.

## Ethical approval

- ERCPN will no longer review external student research projects which are not part of regular FPN research
- Students and their (FPN) supervisors are also no longer required to present to the ERCPN approval letters of external ethical review
- A standard clause will be added to the internship contracts, stating that the scientific research as part of the internship is carried out according to the applicable ethical standards
- Students shall include in their Research Proposal how ethical approval is or will be obtained by the person with the primary responsibility for the design and procedure.
- >> Ethical approval is still needed!

# Application form

- The application form is **NOT** the contract!
- The application form is necessary to make the contract
- Students submit application form online
- Supervisors and student receive emails to check info
- Supervisors and student receive contract

## Internship contract

- Important!
- Your internship should be legal
- Have you met all requirements?
- Your internship is insured
- No application form = no contract = no valid internship = no EC

NB: in case you have not met all requirements and want to apply for an exception: send request to Board of Examiners

## Education and Examination Regulations (EER) and the Rules & Regulations (R&R)

- EER
  - Main rules determined by law and the Faculty Board
  - For the duration of your study
- R&R
  - Contains more details, composed by the Board of Examiners
  - Each year the new R&R applies
  - Chair, Master affairs: Kim Kuypers, PhD

The Research master's study programme is offered on a full-time basis, this refers also to the internship.

For most specializations:  
internship + master's thesis = 50 credits  
=> approximately 32 weeks (Nov-Aug)

When you have to start later with your internship or when you cannot work fulltime on your internship/thesis, you will graduate later.

## Requirements internships RM

- The *research internship* cannot be started until at least 60 credits have been obtained, including both Advanced Statistics courses.
- The *clinical internship* cannot be started until at least 60 credits have been obtained, including both Advanced Statistics courses
  - + PP: Clinical skills (I-IV),
  - + NP: Neuropsychological Assessment,  
Basic Cognitive Psychological Skills  
Neuropsychology in practice

If you deviate from the above without permission from the Board of Examiners, the result of the part in question can be declared invalid.

## Important

- At least a month before you start your internship you have to fill out the internship application form.
- When you meet the requirements for the internship a contract will be made up, which is signed by all parties.

**If you don't apply for the internship, it will be considered illegal, and can be declared invalid.**

## When can you start the internship?

- At the earliest in November (when at least 60 credits have been obtained)
- In all other cases the internship starts at the first of the month after which 60 credits have been obtained.



We are aware that arrangements about the internship might need to be made in advance.

When discussing the starting date of your internship with your supervisor and/or institute keep in mind that the start of the internship is dependent on having fulfilled the requirements. Discuss this with your supervisor.

Although a contract might be made up before exam results are known, it will only be valid when all requirements are fulfilled. There will be a contingency in the contract. The Education Office will check this before the start of the internship

## **Assessment of research internship**

Research proposal: Pass/ fail (1st and 2nd supervisor)

Research internship: Grade of 6.0 or higher (1st supervisor)

- graded part of 10 credits (included in GPA)
- ungraded part rest of credits

Master's thesis: see next page

## Requirements master's thesis

- A Master's thesis is an independently written report of the research which has been conducted during the internship.
- The Master's thesis is an individually\* written paper.
- The final grade needs to be at least a 6.0.
- Will be assessed by first (supervisor) and second assessor.
- Grade of the first and second assessor will be averaged and both need to be sufficient, and can not differ more than 2.0 points.

**\* This means that when you do an internship with a fellow student, each will have to formulate a different research question and no overlap is allowed for the introduction and discussion.**

# Duo internships

- Possible but:
- Both students formulate their own research question
- And write their own thesis etc.
- The UM supervisor monitors this

## **Requirements graduating 'With Distinction'**

- A weighted GPA of at least 8.50 for all parts of the RM which are assessed on a ten-point scale (except electives (RM)).
- All assessments must have been passed on the first attempt .
- All courses/modules need to be passed within two years after the master was started (except the internship).
- Masters thesis: a score of at least 8.0 or average of master's and minor's thesis/activity report at least 8.0.

In order to graduate this academic year, your last work (usually the master thesis) must be submitted for assessment at the latest **on August 31st** (be aware of holiday supervisor).

**Important:** Submit the electronic version of your approved thesis.

You must upload a digital copy of the final version of your Master's Thesis via the online Dors Web Application. Your supervisors will receive an automatic email with all information regarding the assessment of the uploaded document. The thesis will be checked for plagiarism.

NOTE: Please consult the instructions on AskPsy <https://www.askpsy.nl/thesis-masters> about formatting rules and submission of the thesis.

In case you want to do a second master, make sure to hand in your thesis well before the end of August or maybe July! (supervisor, 2nd assessor and EO), so your thesis will be assessed at the latest on August 31st.



- When you submitted the thesis before August 31st, midnight CET, and you receive a pass, you will graduate per August 31.
- If you receive a fail (or emailed your final thesis after August 31st), you will have to register again for the master, and you will get 1 chance to rewrite your thesis>> Resit
- Make arrangements with supervisors when to hand in the resit
- Upload the revised thesis In DorsWeb. Clearly state that it concerns a resit.

# Assessment Criteria Master Internship

The practical part of the master internship is assessed on several criteria. Assessors shall not mark all criteria (not all criteria might be applicable,) and might indicate those criteria that are noticeable (poor/unsatisfactory or good/very good), to provide the student with helpful information. -- = poor; - = unsatisfactory; +/- = borderline; + = sufficient, ++ = good; +++ = very good, NA = not applicable. Note that the outcome is not simply the sum of pluses and minuses.

## Internships abroad for Master students

The FPN International Relations Office (IRO) is there to help you with the practical and financial part of an internship abroad.

### Why do an internship abroad?

More than a quarter of UM students spend a period abroad as part of their studies, which is a higher proportion than at any other university in the Netherlands. This is an excellent way for students to immerse themselves in other cultures and become more familiar with other languages.

- Time abroad will enable you to discover how your chosen field of study is regarded in other countries.
- You will be exposed to different ways of thinking and living, giving you a fresh perspective on your own thinking and way of life.
- Many employers highly value a period abroad, which will increase your employability and job prospects.

Scholarships are available for students who wish to do their internship abroad. Please this [link](#) for more information about the scholarships.

# The International Relations Office (IRO)

**Staff:** Merlijne van Overbruggen, Ellen Blaauw, Debbie Bloot

- The IRO provides scholarships and support on practical matters related to an internship abroad. E.g. general advice on housing, insurance, language preparation.
- The IRO doesn't have formal agreements for internship purposes, nor a list of internship options. The IRO cannot mediate in finding an internship abroad. Always get in touch with your internship coordinator, to discuss how to proceed.

## UM COVID-19 policy on internships abroad (spring 2021)

- Internships within the [EU](#), [Erasmus+ Programme Countries](#) and Andorra, Monaco, San Marino, Switzerland, the UK and the Vatican City State, are allowed to destinations with a color code green, yellow or orange [travel advice](#) (issued by Dutch government);
- Internships outside of Europe are allowed, provided that the destination is included in the (regularly updated) [EU Safe List](#) (at the time of departure);
- Internships in a code *orange* destination within Europe or a country in the EU Safe List is allowed if a substantial part of the internship takes place partly or physically at a location to be designated by the internship organization;
- Internships in regions with a color code *red* are never allowed;
- If your intended host country is not/no longer on the EU safe list, please notify the FPN IRO through [AskPsy](#). Exemptions for essential study components may exceptionally be granted by the Faculty Board on a case-by-basis if no alternatives are available;
- Ensure that an academic back-up plan is in place, in consultation with supervisors

Decision on [UM COVID-19 policy for internships abroad in Fall 2021](#) expected in March. Updates through UM/FPN News, [UM COVID-19](#) / [FPN COVID-19](#) websites and UM e-mail.

## Impact COVID-19 on internships abroad

- An internship abroad may be cancelled/interrupted, e.g. in case of a lock-down/closure of the host institution, due to travel restrictions, or if the travel advice for your destination changes to red, or no longer appears on the EU safe list. It is important to keep yourself informed of the travel advice and to stay in close contact with your supervisors, and FPN IRO;
- Be aware that possible financial, academic and health consequences of an internship abroad are entirely at your own risk;
- You are responsible for making the necessary arrangements (e.g. taking out adequate health, travel and liability insurance), and for keeping yourself informed on the safety situation and travel advice;
- Any costs incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic, such as (late) cancellation of a flight, (forced) repatriation, or illness, are borne entirely by the students (unless covered by their travel and/or health insurance, or unless covered by Erasmus+ Force Majeure: see FAQ's on [UM COVID-19 website](#)).



## Brexit: impact on Erasmus+ internship in UK?

The UK will be leaving the EU subsidized Erasmus+ programme after the current Erasmus+ 2020 Call (ends on 31 May 2022). Impact:

- **Internships in the UK under the terms of the Erasmus+ programme may still be possible until end May 2022.** It is however not sure whether we can allocate Erasmus+ scholarships for UK exchanges in 2021/22. This depends on the available UM Erasmus+ budget for 2021/22. We hope to have more clarity in March/April. We'll keep you updated!
- **No alternative UM/FPN funding scheme.** As of 2021/2022, due to drastic cutbacks, no FPN funding for exchanges to non-Erasmus+ participating countries/outside Europe. Check other options, e.g. Student Funding Portals ([Beursopener](#), [European Funding Guide](#), [Scholarship Portal](#)).
- **Immigration requirements after Brexit?**  
See the website of the UK embassy for the visa procedure, and ask host institution for advice.

**IMPORTANT!** If you think about doing an internship in the UK, carefully check whether you have sufficient financial means, since we cannot guarantee Erasmus+ funding (nor alternative scholarships)! Also ask your potential host institution whether they can accept you (either within or outside the Erasmus+ traineeship scheme), and if you can be waived from paying tuition/bench fees!

# Scholarships

## **Erasmus+ scholarship (internship within EU).**

Excl. Switzerland, possibly incl. UK (depending on available budget!)

Information on Erasmus+ scholarships for 2021/22 (amount, application form, conditions, deadlines) will be available in Spring 2021 on [www.askpsy.nl/iro/grant-opportunities](http://www.askpsy.nl/iro/grant-opportunities).

**No FPN scholarships for exchanges/internships outside EU** as of 2021/2022 due to drastic cutbacks.

**Other scholarships?** See [www.beursopener.nl](http://www.beursopener.nl); [www.european-funding-guide.eu](http://www.european-funding-guide.eu), [www.scholarshipportal.com](http://www.scholarshipportal.com).

**Note:** Be careful making preparations involving costs until there's certainty on whether your physical internship can take place!

No FPN/UM-wide reimbursement scheme. Students whose Erasmus+ internship is cancelled/interrupted, may be eligible for a (partial) refund under the terms of the Erasmus+ Force Majeure regulation. See [UM COVID-19 FAQ's](#).

No EU decision yet if this regulation applies to Erasmus+ mobilities in 2021/22.

## Visa matters

- To find out if/which visa you need, consult the website of your host country's embassy for the most up-to-date visa application procedure. For information on embassies, visa, vaccinations [www.minbuza.nl](http://www.minbuza.nl).
- It's your responsibility to apply for a visa through the embassy. Visa regulations are subject to change and may differ per student (e.g. due to nationality, duration of stay).
- Check whether your host university (IRO/visa office) supports students with the visa application.
- Start to apply and to arrange the necessary documents in time! The rules are strict, especially for entering the US, Canada, the UK (especially for non-EU students)!

## Insurance

- Make sure to arrange adequate health/liability insurance. Consult your insurance company to find out whether you are sufficiently covered throughout your entire stay abroad.  
*\* check the coverage during COVID-19*
- For some non-EU countries you may need additional coverage because of the extremely high medical expenses (US, Canada).
- Not sufficiently covered? Alternative insurance package, e.g. AON, IPS.
- Your host institution is responsible for concluding a liability insurance. The UM does provide a back-up liability insurance.  
You are responsible for concluding a liability insurance for time outside work.

# Housing

How to find housing abroad?

## Important notes!

- Ask your host institution whether they charge tuition/service fees for visiting students (e.g. interns). EU students may be exempted by registering for the 'Erasmus + Traineeship scheme'.
- You have to remain registered and pay tuition fees to UM throughout your entire studies (incl. internship period).  
No valid registration = no validation (ECTS) of your internship!
- Need an official document confirming your registration at UM, and that the internship is an official part of your curriculum?

## Clinical internships

=> To acquire experience in clinical skills

Optional in RMPP and RMNP

## However:

- You might well do **a research internship in a clinical setting/ with patients as participants** (e.g., in a forensic hospital, mental health institute etc).

# What is the clinical internship?

## Clinical internship

- 520 hours (4 months minimal; may include the 200 hours Psychodiagnostics internship)
- Under supervision of psychologist in setting
- You also need supervisor from FPN
- Write clinical activities report (NB: plagiarism check!)
- Evaluation/ assessment by psychologist in setting
- **For NP and PP: you conduct a small-scale research project, write a proposal and minor thesis >> ethical approval! (except in case of retrospective file investigations)**
- **Best option:** go to a place where they are involved in research and therefore already have projects running with ethics approval

# Formalities clinical internship

- Application form
- Backup plan
- You need UM supervisor (PhD)
- Contract
- Meeting with UM supervisor before internship, in the middle, and at the end
- At the end: meeting (in person, through skype, phone or email) of student with supervisor of the institution and UM supervisor

## Backup plan

- Will you be able/allowed to access the internship setting?
- Will you be able/allowed to see patients?
- Can you find alternative ways to see patients (online?)  
Can you finish the internship online?
- Will you be able to do psychodiagnostics (important for the case reports)?
  
- Possible alternatives:
- Online internship? What about the case reports?
- Extend / postpone? Risky-costly
- Switch to research variant: contact track coordinator!
  - If possible: extend research internship and master thesis
  - Or: write literature review including proposal

## Clinical internship; possibilities

- Separate clinical internship
- Combined research+clinical internship
- Time period and duration:
  - Research internship: 8-10 months
  - Research & clinical at same institution: 8-10 months
  - Research + clinical at separate institutions: 5-7 + 3-4
  - Clinical + research at separate institutions : 3-4 + 5-7

## Assessment clinical internship RM (NP/PP)

Clinical research proposal: Pass/ fail  
(UM faculty supervisor)

Clinical internship:

- Clinical Activities Report Pass/fail  
(UM supervisor)
- Performance Pass/fail  
(supervisor institute)

Minor's thesis: Grade of 6.0 or higher  
(UM faculty supervisor/assessor)

# Several ways can lead to BAPD

## 1. FPN-Student

1. Within curriculum (FP, RMNP, RMPP)
